


Family Life Building



Overview

With one practical, simple, and cost-effective building, we'll build an attractive outreach to the children in our community, plus offer expanded space for virtually every other ministry on campus!

This has always been the final piece of the original master plan for the TLC campus, and it's easy to see why! This really isn't about a new facility; it's about enhancing and expanding our ministry to people of all ages.

Why build it?

Studies show the primary determining factor for families looking for a church home... is children's ministry. Parents are looking for a clean, safe, fun environment that they can trust, and their kids will love.

There's also a dramatic increase in parents seeking a Christian school environment. But our school growth is capped because of our facilities.

Such a building will also be a "rising tide that lifts all boats": When elementary-aged children move to this new building from other places on campus, all other ministries will get space to grow too.

- Three-story building

Here's how the whole church benefits:

Preschool

Though the church preschool has a waiting list, we're unable to accommodate the need — because there's no more room. A new children's ministry building will open up most of the building currently used by our kindergarten classes for exciting preschool expansion!

Junior high and high school groups now meet in Monschke Hall classrooms, severely limiting growth in their ministries. A new children's building will open up the entire Fireside and Gym building for youth ministry use!

Jr. High & High School Ministries

Elementary Ages


TLC has never had a building devoted to kindergarten through sixth grade students. They now meet in portable buildings — or in other rooms not designed for elementary ages. A new children's building will provide a central location for parents to drop off their children, and an environment specifically designed for kids.

School enrollment keeps climbing even as space is dwindling. Imagine a K-8 school with facilities expertly designed for its specific needs, rather than making do with converted portables and church nursery facilities!

Adult Ministries



When they're able to move into the gym — because the elementary ages move from the gym into the new building — these rooms could be turned back into large adult classrooms!





Financial Health

The church has no debt, no mortgage. We have a balanced budget, and giving has grown – this year we’re experiencing our highest giving ever. Plus, we’ve raised millions to remodel each building on campus over the last 12 years with no debt. Each time we raised funds for a remodel, the campaign lasted just a few months, and brought in between \$500,000 to \$2 million. For the new building, we anticipate a four-year pledge campaign of \$10.7 million.
