# **Daily Meditations**

Brief daily devotions based on this week's topic

Some devotional questions were adapted from The Serendipity New Testament for Groups and NavPress LessonMaker.

#### Monday

What point in this weekend's message hit home for you?

Read Luke 15:11-24. How did the younger son live when he was out on his own? What happened to him there?

Why did the father call for a celebration?

How have you been like the prodigal son in this story?

What do the actions of the father represent?

Today thank God for His amazing love for you! If you are a prodigal, now is the day to come home running into His arms! Also, please pray that next weekend's concert will honor God with artistic excellence and reach out to the prodigal sons and daughters!

#### **Tuesday**

Read Luke 15:25-32. What complaints did the older brother bring to his father?

Why did the father want the older brother to be happy?

When have you been like the older brother? How do "church people" act like the older brother at times?

Read Luke 14:15-24. How would it feel to plan a big event and have no one attend?

How did the master ensure that the banquet would be full?

How does your responsibility to God correspond to the actions of the servant?

Pray that your heart will be full of joy as you see prodigals hearing the message of God's love next weekend — and go to the "highways and byways" to invite them. Please pray that this weekend's concert will be full of "prodigals" who will return to their Heavenly Father.

### Wednesday

Please read Luke 15:1-7. As a child, did you ever get lost from your family or group? What happened?

Have you ever lost a child somewhere for a time? What did that feel like?

In verse 2, what were the religious leaders grumbling about?

### Wednesday (continued)

In this parable, how might the sheep have gotten lost? How do you go astray?

How does a shepherd bring a lost sheep home (v. 5)?

What does he do when he brings the sheep home?

What can you do this week to help bring the lost sheep home? Pray about who you might invite to the next two weekends at church! Also, please pray that the musicians in this weekend's concert will stay spiritually and physically healthy. Pray for safe travel for the musical group "Rescue".

### **Thursday**

Read Luke 15:8-10. What emotions do you feel when you find a valuable item that was lost?

What can you learn about God from this parable?

What can you learn about how God values people from this parable?

With what "lost coin" can you share an invitation to the concert this weekend — or otherwise share the message of God's persistent love for them?

Thank God for his patience and persistence in restoring you to Him!

Please pray that God will be honored in this weekend's concerts. Tonight is the dress rehearsal, so please pray that it goes smoothly. Consider coming to an early show, and then returning to a later show with some "lost sheep" or "lost coins" you've invited!

#### **Friday**


In summary of all the passages we've seen so far this week, how do these three parables answer the Pharisees' objection in Luke 15:2? What do they explain about why Jesus came to earth?

Today I would like to ask you to spend some extra time in prayer dedicating the evangelistic mission of this weekend's concerts to God in prayer. Pray that the musicians and singers themselves will grow through this ministry. Pray that the people who attend, whether believers or seekers, will grow closer to Christ. Pray that God will lay on your heart the names of some you may have yet to invite. Pray that the brief yet important message delivered by René would be empowered and blessed by the Holy Spirit to move people's hearts closer to God. Thank you!

#### Saturday

Please meditate on this week's memory verse. What does it teach you about the heart of God? How does this explain the reason for Christmas? Finish any devotions you may have missed, and please ask God to supernaturally work in the hearts of all who attend the weekend concerts.
