Daily Meditations

Monday

After spending 40 days studying faith from all angles, I thought it would be a good thing to spend Thanksgiving week focusing and meditating on God's faithfulness. Each day we'll read a passage of scripture, spend some time meditating on it and answer a few questions about the passage.

Spend a few moments in prayer before you read Psalm 57. Ask God to encourage you with His faithfulness and speak to you through His word.

What do you learn about God's faithfulness in this passage?

What encourages most as you read this passage?

What can you apply to your life this week?

Thank God today for three ways that you have seen His mercy in your life. Thank Him for His love and faithfulness to you. Ask God to remind you throughout the day of His faithfulness. Pray that your faith will grow as you reflect on His faithfulness.

Tuesday

Spend a few moments in prayer before you read Psalm 86. Ask God to encourage you with His faithfulness and speak to you through His word.

What do you learn about God's faithfulness in this passage?

What encourages most as you read this passage?

What can you apply to your life this week?

Thank God today for His forgiveness and goodness. Ask God to use you as a source of encouragement in the lives of others today. Pray that as you study God's word you will apply it to your life daily.

Wednesday

Spend a few moments in prayer before you read Lamentations 3:18-26. Ask God to encourage you with His faithfulness and speak to you through His word.

What do you learn about God's faithfulness in this passage?

What encourages most as you read this passage?

Wednesday (continued)

What can you apply to your life this week?

Thank God today that no matter what you have encountered in life God's faithfulness never ends. Talk to God about the areas of your life where you feel "that all you've hoped from the Lord is gone." Ask God to restore your hope in some way today.

Thursday

Happy Thanksgiving! Spend a few moments in prayer before you read Psalm 100. Ask God to encourage you with His faithfulness and speak to you through His word.

What do you learn about God's faithfulness in this passage?

What encourages most as you read this passage?

What can you apply to your life this week?

As you spend time in prayer today focus on thanksgiving. Try to spend five minutes thanking God for whatever comes to your mind.

Friday

Spend a few moments in prayer before you read Psalm 28. Ask God to encourage you with His faithfulness and speak to you through His word.

What do you learn about God's faithfulness in this passage?

What encourages most as you read this passage?

What can you apply to your life this week?

Thank God today for His help and concern for you. Pray for those in your life who are struggling with hope and faith. Ask God to for opportunities to share the hope and faith you have in Christ,

Saturday

Look back over the devotions this week. What stands out to you most about God's faithfulness?

Please pray for the services this weekend. Pray that God will use them to focus people on thankfulness and help set the stage for a wonderful holiday season here at TLC.
