

Five Biblical Principles for Managing Money

1. Keep _____ "Riches can disappear fast...so watch your business interests closely. Know the state of your flocks" Proverbs 27:23 (LB)

2. Plan"Plan carefully and you will have plenty; if you act too quickly, you will never have enough." Pr. 21:5 (GN)

3. Save"The wise man saves for the future, but stupid people spend their money as fast as they get it." Pr. 21:20a (GN)

"...he who gathers money little by little makes it grow." Prov. 13:11

4. Enjoy

"When God gives any man wealth and possessions, and enables him to enjoy them, to accept his lot and be happy in his work --this is a gift of God." Eccl. 5:19 (See Eccl. 6:3-6)

"I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances." Phil. 4:11

"...godliness with contentment is great gain ...if we have food and clothing; we will be content with that. People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs." 1Tim. 6:6-10

5. Put

5. PutJesus said, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal... No one can serve two masters... You cannot serve both God and Money." Matt. 6:19, 20, 24

Daily Meditations

In what ways can you master money?

How can you invest in eternity today?

Spend time today asking God to help you evaluate your use of money according to Jesus' words in this passage. Thanks God for His blessings.

Wednesday

Read 1Timothy 6:5-19. By most international standards, nearly all of us in California are rich. What command is given to us in verse 18?

How do people put their hope in riches?

What does Paul tell Timothy to pursue? How do you do that?

How is this different from what our culture tells us to pursue?

What "principle to live by" do you find in this passage?

Thank God for giving you everything for your enjoyment. Ask Him to help you put your hope not in riches, but to enjoy what you have as His gift to you. Ask Him to help you pursue faith and godliness.

Thursday

Read Exodus 20:17. How is the problem of "coveting" related to many money problems? What other problems can it lead to?

What do you "covet"?

In what areas have you overcome covetousness in your life?

Read Proverbs 3:9,10. How can you practice this?

How does this help keep your heart in line regarding money?

Ask God to help you do a "fearless inventory" of your soul regarding covetousness today. Ask God to give you a contented spirit.

Friday

Read Matt. 18:20. Where does Jesus say He will be?

Have you ever felt the presence of Christ in a gathering of Christians? What happened?

Read Matt. 25:35-40. How do we encounter Jesus when we serve others?

This week look for opportunities to help others, and view these times as if you were helping Jesus himself-- because that's how he views them!

Thank God for a healthy church! Pray for the continued health of churches in our area, including our own!

Saturday
