

Part 1: The Dating Game

"Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. Monday

Read 1 John 4:10-11. This is a great foundation verse for understanding love. Why do you think it's important to understand how God loves you before you know how to love others?

Tuesday

Read Matt. 11:28. Jesus often talked about rest in the Bible. He set an example for us in this, but we still tend to resist rest. Why is it difficult for you to make rest or playing a regular part of your life?

If you're married, when's the last time you and your spouse just took time to play together? What are the benefits of those times to your relationship?

If you're single, when's the last time you took the time to just hang out with friends and play? What are the benefits of those times to you?

Thank God today that He wants you to rest and play. Thank Him for the ways He's made you and the interests you have. Ask Him to help you overcome the obstacles to playing and make it a regular part of your relationships.

Wednesday

Read Phil 4:6-7. What is your definition of prayer? According to these verses, what are the benefits of prayer?

How do you think praying together strengthens a marriage?

If you're married, how often do you and your spouse pray together?

How can you make praying together a regular part of your marriage? How do you think that will impact your relationship?

If you're single: Write down the name of someone you could pray with on a regular basis. What would the benefit of that be?

Thank God today for prayer. Thank Him for His peace. Ask Him to spur you on to make prayer a regular part of your relationship.

Thursday

Read Prov. 16:24, 18:21 & Eph. 4:29. Words are so powerful! What you say and how you say it are so important.

Recall a time when you used words poorly. What was the impact on your relationship?

Recall a time when you used words well. What impact did that have?

When is it difficult for you to control your tongue?

Spend additional time in prayer today asking God to help you in the area of what you say to people and how you say it. Ask Him to give you a heart that desires to say, "I love you", "I'm sorry" and "I forgive you". Ask Him to bring to your mind anyone who needs to hear these words from you today. Commit the words you say today to God and ask Him to use you to bring healing to the hearts of those around you.

Friday

Read Eph. 5:1-2. Focus on the phrase "live a life of love". Think about your day yesterday. How did you "live a life of love"?

How will today be different if you use this phrase as your standard?

Thank God today for His example of love to you. Ask Him to help you live a life of love today. Ask Him for the desire and courage to be a force of love in your relationships.

Saturday
