Tuesday

In the passage we studied Sunday from Romans 8, Paul says we don't have to fear death or life. Which do you fear the most: death or life?

Read 1 Cor. 15:54, Phil. 1:20. What do these passages say about death and the believer?

Why can believers be confident even in the face of death?

Today, thank God for the fact that He makes a death a doorway, not a wall. Thank Him that He is with you during each day of your life, too!

Wednesday

Read Hebrews 13:6, Ps. 56:11, Ps. 118:6. What truth is repeated in these verses?

How does this tie in with Paul's theme in Romans 8:35-39?

How does God's continued, promised presence help you in times of trouble? Give an example from your own life.

Thank God today for His loving presence-- from which you can never be separated!

Thursday

Read Joshua chapter 1. How many times in this one chapter does God say to Joshua to "be strong and courageous"?

What reasons does God give as to why Joshua should be confident?

How does this relate to Paul's point in Romans 8:35-39?

Today think of an area where you are afraid. Ask God to help you to be strong and courageous because of the truths about Him taught in Joshua 1 and Romans 8!

Friday

Today, read the entire 8th chapter of Romans. As you look back over this chapter, what passages jump out at you as being particularly intriguing or relevant?

Have any of these truths changed you? How?

Are there passages you've understood better as a result of this 5 week study?

Today thank God for the wonderful truths in Romans 8.
