Daily Meditations

Here's a chance to "take it home": Spend a few minutes every day reading Scripture, praying, and answering thought provoking questions about this weekend's topic!

This week's memory verse:

"Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable his judgments, and his paths beyond tracing out!" Romans 11:33

Monday

Look back over your message notes. Which points made the most impact on you?

Which of these attitudes do you struggle with? How so?

How do the following verses relate to the theme of Romans 11: Deuteronomy 31:6,8; Lamentations 3:22,23; Matt. 28:20; John 10:28; Romans 8:38-39

Thank God today for His wonderful mercies to you-- that He never gives up on you! Pray specifically for people you know who need to know of God's gospel of grace and mercy.

Tuesday

Read Romans 11:1-10. How did Paul answer those who believed God had rejected the Jews?

Paul describes salvation by grace in verse 6. In your observation, are church people today relying more on works or grace? How so?

How is it possible to seek God intently by doing good deeds, yet miss Him?

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Paul uses the example of Elijah in verses 3 and 4. Have you ever felt like the only one left who seems to care about God? When?

How is God's answer to Elijah a comfort to you?

When did you encounter a "remnant" of believers in your life?

Thank God for His salvation by grace. Ask Him to help you locate the "remnant" of believers in your own neighborhood, school, or workplace. Pray for those believers—that they may stand strong in God's grace and be, along with you, a great witness of God to your community.

Wednesday

Read Romans 11:11-25. What words or phrases indicate what the Gentile believers were thinking?

What attitude should they have about their acceptance by God?

Why do you think pride was a danger for the Roman Christians?

How have you seen the arrogance of some Christians about their saved status hurt the cause of Christ?

Ask God to give you both confidence in His grace and also humility about your salvation. Ask Him to root out any ungodly pride in your life about being saved. Ask Him to help you truly love and care for the lost, and not to be arrogant or look down on them. Thank Him for His grace to you!

Thursday

Read Romans 11:25-32. What promise has God made to Israel?

What does Paul say about God's promises and calling? (verse 29)

In verses 30-32, Paul talks about God's mercy when we're disobedient. When has God shown you mercy despite your disobedience?

Thank God specifically for His mercy on you today! Praise Him for His irrevocable calling and gifts!

Friday

Read Romans 11:33-36. When you were a child, what was your idea of God?

How has this changed as you've grown?

Is it tough for you to live with the fact that God's "paths are beyond tracing out"-- in other words, that His purposes and reasons can never be fully understood here on earth?

What words does Paul use to describe God's mind? (verses 33,34)

What does God owe you? (verse 36)

Why do you think Paul concludes Romans 9-11 with this paragraph of pure awe and worship?

How is this different from the way theology is often approached?

Today spend some time in awe and wonder of God, who doesn't fit tidily in our boxes! Thank Him specifically for the fact that "his paths are beyond tracing out".

Saturday
