Part 8: Eyes on the Prize 2 Cor. 4:16 - 5:10

In today's passage of Scripture, the Apostle Paul reminds us-- the best is yet to come Keeping our eyes on heaven makes all the difference here on earth. Need hope? Encouragement? Endurance? Keep your eyes on the prize by focusing on:

"Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

"Now we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life." 2 Cor. 5:1-4

Thank God today for the promise of heaven. Thank Him for placing in your heart a longing for your eternal home. Pray that you will be encouraged today by the hope of your eternal home and pray that you'll be an encouragement to others.

Thursday

Read 2 Cor. 5:5-8, Eph. 1:11-14 & Heb. 11:1. According to these verses, for what purpose has God made you?

How does knowing you are made for heaven encourage you today?

How does the Spirit guarantee what is to come? How does this impact your daily life

What have you learned about walking by faith this week?

Thank God today for the Holy Spirit that daily reminds you that you have a heavenly Father who loves you. Thank Him for the promise that at the moment you die you'll be with Him. Talk to God about walking by faith and not by sight. Ask Him to grow your faith and confidence in Him.

Friday

Read 1 Cor. 2:9 & 2 Cor. 5:9-10. What do these verses tell you about Paul's attitude toward life on earth and heaven?

Do you think Paul was motivated more by the desire to be with God or fear of judgment? Which motivates you most often?

Think back over your day yesterday. Which choices and activities reflected heaven's priorities best?

In what area of your life are you struggling to keep heaven's priorities at the top? What have you learned this week to help you?

Thank God today for His love. Talk to Him about your priorities. Ask Him to show you any areas where your priorities do not align with His best for you. Ask Him to remind you each time you make a choice today to keep an eternal perspective and choose accordingly.
