Monday

How can your soul be "stilled and quieted" as you think of God's wonder and mystery?

Today pray the prayer of these psalms; Be in awe of God!

Thursday

Read Ephesians 3:14-21 for a New Testament prayer about God's mystery and wonder! What does Paul pray that the Ephesians grasp (v. 18,19)?

How would you express this prayer in your own words?

How do you think you and your friends would pray if you prayed this for each other? (Try it and see!)

Pray this prayer for the loved ones in your life-- and for yourself-today! Thank God for the love of Christ Paul talks about in this passage!

Friday

Read Psalm 139:7-12. This is the passage we'll be looking at in the services this weekend. How would you express these verses in your own words?

How does it make you feel to know God is always with you?

Specifically meditate on these verses in preparation for this weekend's message.

Thank God that according to these verses, He is there with you, right now! Give him all your needs and worries. Praise and thank Him for specific acts in history and in your life.
