# Daily Meditations

Brief daily Bible studies and questions for reflection on today's topic!

## This week's memory verse:

*"He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." Rev. 21:4*

## Monday

What point or points stood out to you from the weekend message? Why do you think many people don't think much about heaven? What are they missing?

Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11. What was the source of Paul's teaching about what happens to those who die? (verse 15)

What sequence of events will signal the Lord's return? How will the Lord return? (vs 1-3)

What hope can you gain from these verses?

*Thank God that Jesus Christ will return some day, and we will see reunion, reward, we will be released, and He will be revealed at last in all His glory! Ask Him to help this make a difference in your life today.*

## Tuesday

Read Revelation 20:11-15. Who will be involved in the final judgment? On what basis will people be judged?

What will happen to those whose names are not found in the book of life?

How should the certainty of future judgment determine the way we live now?

The key question: How does a person get his or her name recorded in the book of life? (See John 6:28, 29)

*If you haven't yet done so, ask God today to write your name in that book. You can pray a prayer like this: Father, as much as I understand how, I now give my life to you. I accept Christ's atoning sacrifice for me on the cross. I want to live right through the power of your grace from this day forward. Thank you for your forgiveness and mercy. In the name of Jesus Christ, amen.*

## Wednesday

Read Revelation 21:1-27. In his vision, what did John see coming out of heaven?

How did the voice describe the new world to come?

How does this description help give perspective to the things we go through now?

*Ask God to help you remember the glories that await!*

## Thursday

Read Revelation 22:1-6, a further description of your eternal home, if you've received Christ as Savior. What was growing on each side of the river?

Of what value are the leaves of the tree of life?

What does this passage tell us about God?

How can you honor the life God created?

*Again, ask God to help you live joyfully in light of the promised land of the new heaven and earth!*

## Friday

Read Revelation 22:7-21. What is one reward you remember getting?

What promise did Christ make in verse 7?

What invitation is given by the Spirit and the bride?

What is involved in responding to God's invitation to come to Him?

What do we know for sure about Christ's return? (verse 20)

*Ask God to help you live in light of this great truth! What can you do to bring someone to heaven with you?*
