WHAT'S DIFFERENT ABOUT A WORLD-CHANGING CHURCH?

"Now those who had been scattered by the persecution in connection with Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, telling the message only to Jews. Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to s

peak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord."

"During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.) The disciples, each according to his ability, decided to provide help for the brothers living in Judea. This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul."

Acts 11:19-21, 27-30

1. They're dedicated to giving away extra resources!

"In the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen (who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch) and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' So after they had fasted and prayed, they placed their hands on them and sent them off."

Acts 13:1-3

How can understanding all that you enjoy in Christ impact your heart and ministry to others?

Thank God today for the amazing blessings He has given you. Pray that you'll be a conduit of His blessings to those you cross paths with today.

Friday

Read 2 Corinthians 4. Paul was one of the best and brightest in his day and he gave up everything to follow God. What do you learn in this passage about the reality of following God?

How do these verses give you hope? How will you apply them specifically to your life?

Thank God today that no matter what you encounter in the days ahead God will be with you. Thank Him that your service to Him is never in vain.

Saturday

Today polish up that memory verse. Please pray also for services this weekend, that God's presence would be sensed in a powerful way.
