#### **Thursday**

Read Philippians 1:18-26. How does Paul feel about his circumstances? How might your circumstances serve to advance the gospel? What hinders you from having Paul's attitudes toward people and circumstances? What can you do to have a better attitude?

What two things kept Paul going, according to this verse? Do you focus on these things in your tough times? Which of the two is hardest for you to focus on?

What are your "eager expectations" for the day?

Ask the Lord to help you remember that people really are praying for you! (Our pastoral staff does ever Thursday at noon!) Hang in there — and let the Spirit of God strengthen you today! You are going to make it!

#### **Friday**

Read Phil. 1:27-30. How do you feel when reading "it has been granted to you not only to believe... but also to suffer"? Of course, whether we like to think about it or not, this is a fact of life: We will suffer in life, and sometimes specifically for our faith. Why do you suppose, in a letter about joy, Paul wanted the Philippians to hear this truth so bluntly?

As you go through your day today, make the first phrase in verse 27 your goal. Pray that God will help you conduct yourself in such a manner — with joy and grace!

### **Saturday**

Today finish any devotions you may have missed, and polish up the memory. Please pray for tomorrow's services- for all the workers and teachers, that we'll be serving in the joy of the Lord!

# **Daily Meditations**

Brief daily devotions based on this week's topic

This week's memory verse: "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21

#### Monday

Read the entire passage: Philippians 1:12-30. Looking back over this weekend's message, what major theme or point meant the most to you? Have you seen these truths make a difference in your life already? How? What concepts will you try to remember and develop in your own life for this week?

Fill in this blank honestly: "For me to live is ."

Tell the Lord about tough times you may be facing – or pray for others who are facing tough times. Ask him for the peace that passes understanding.

#### **Tuesday**

Read Philippians 1:12-13. Paul mentions his chains in verse 13. Who was Paul chained to? How did this advance the gospel? Has God "chained" you to anyone (in a hospital bed, office, family, etc.) in order for you to share the gospel with them? How can you use these chains to the advantage of the gospel?

Read Romans 8:28-30. How do these verses relate to this topic?

Ask the Lord to help you view your circumstances – even your chains – with joy; not simplistic Pollyanna thinking, but true joy that comes from knowing He can use even our pain to further His work!

## Wednesday

Read Philippians 1:14-18.

According to this verse, how have the other Christians responded to the fact that Paul is in chains? Why are they now more free to share the gospel rather than live in fear? Why do you think the Christian church has tended to grow more rapidly in many areas where it is under persecution? Do you grow when persecuted? Why or why not?

According to these verses, did even some of the early Christian preachers have mixed motives? Why do you think preachers sometimes are tempted to "preach Christ out of vanity"? What is Paul's attitude toward these people? How does this compare with your attitude toward pastors of other churches? Why do you think Paul is so tolerant of the preachers he mentions in this passage, and yet stands so firmly against the false teachers he mentions in Galatians chapter 1?

Today ask the Lord to help you keep your eyes on Him when you go through tough times! Pray for our Christian brothers and sisters throughout the world now being persecuted for their faith—pray that we'll experience their commitment and they'll experience our freedom!

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
