What do these verses tell you about the importance God places on caring for the poor?

Think of three things you can do in the next week to assist the poor.

How can you reach out to them in the next week?

Thank God today for the physical health you enjoy. Thank Him for His ongoing work in your spiritual life. Pray for those you know who are sick (if you need help check out the TLC prayer list available at the information desk). Pray that God will use you to minister to the sick in your life.
