Three reasons to celebrate:

1. Remember "You and the Levites and the aliens among you shall **rejoice in all the good things the LORD** your God has given to you and your household." Deuteronomy 26:11

times in the Bible we're commanded to remember what God has done!

"Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past." Deuteronomy 32:7

"Not to us, O LORD, not to us but to your name be the glory, because of your love and faithfulness." Psalm 115:1

Some of this past year's amazing harvest:

2. Realize

"Be joyful at your feast... for **the Lord your God will bless you** in all your harvest and in all the work of your hands, and your joy will be complete." Deuteronomy 16:14,15

"'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you **bope** and a **future**." Jeremiah 29:11

Jesus: "I tell you, look at the fields! They are **ripe for barvest**." John 4:35

Some of the ways we're planning for harvest this year:

3. Renew

(At the end of an eight-day feast) "We are making a binding agreement... we assume responsibility... we will not neglect the house of our God.' Nehemiah 10:35,39

"Joshua told the people, 'Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the LORD will do amazing things among you." Joshua 3:5

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer... they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." Acts 2:42-47

How I can help in the harvest field this year:

Daily Meditations

Brief daily devotions based on this week's topic

Monday

Read Psalm 105:1-5. What did you learn about the importance of celebrating God's faithfulness last weekend?

As you look back over the last year at TLC what are you most thankful for? How has God used TLC in your life in the last year?

Thank God today for His faithfulness to you and TLC in the last year. Thank Him for His work in your life. Pray that God will continue to use TLC to be a beacon of hope and truth in your life and the community as a whole.

<u>Tuesday</u>

Read Deuteronomy 8:1-5, 32:1-7, 1 Samuel 7:12 & Psalm 115:1. What great things are listed in these verses that God has done?

Why do you think God places such an emphasis on remembering what He has done in the past? How have you seen the importance of this in your life?

What "systems" do you have in place for remembering God's faithfulness to you? How can recounting God's faithfulness help you resist the temptation to worry?

Take time today to thank God for at least ten ways you've seen His faithfulness in your life. Pray about the things that are troubling you right now. Ask God to strengthen your faith and confidence in Him. Pray that you'll be an encouragement to those you encounter today.

Wednesday

Read Joshua 1:1-9, Jeremiah 29:11, Matthew 16:13-18 & 28:16-20. What do these verses teach you about God's power over the future? What do they say about His plans for your future?

Are you a glass-half-empty person or a glass-half-full person? Would your closest friend agree with your answer? How does that attitude impact your view of the future?

How can you use the verses you read today to develop a more godly view of your future?

What are two ways you can celebrate the promise of your future with God this week?

Thank God today that He knows the future and has plans designed just for you! Thank Him that he will be with you each step of the way. Pray that you will see your future through God's eyes. Pray that your faith in God's ways and plans will grow.

Thursday

Read Joshua 1:10-18, 3:5, 24:14-18 & Acts 2:42-47. What do you learn about commitment from the Israelites and the early Church?

Saturday
