What would you say Jesus sees as the main evil of the Pharisees? How can Christians keep from falling into the same sin?

Where do you need to be cleansed on the inside, not just the outside?

Ask God to help us as a church and as individuals to stay far from hypocrisy. Ask Him to help us be cleansed inside, not just outside.

Friday

The book of Galatians is one of Paul's first letters, and yet already he is warning the church against leaders who are taking them astray. Read Gal. 1:6-9 and Gal. 5:7-10.

In your opinion, what "distorted gospel" is getting popular in America right now? How does this lead people astray? How could it keep the church from its task of making disciples and loving others in word and deed?

Ask God to prevent you and the church from believing a distorted gospel. Ask Him to help us stay focused on Jesus.

Benefits of the Church Throughout History

Human Rights

Christians headed the movements to combat human rights abuses such as infanticide; gladiatorial combat in the Roman Empire; slavery; child labor, etc. (see Luis Palau, <u>God Is</u> <u>Relevant</u>, New York: Doubleday, p. 177-178)

Relief Work

Christians established the first charitable medical hospitals; the first emergency shelters for the homeless; the first homes for orphans; the first humanitarian institutions for the insane; the first ministries to victims of crime; the first outreaches to prisoners, hospital patients, and soldiers; and the first societies for the prevention of cruelty to animals (see Luis Palau, <u>God Is Relevant</u>, New York: Doubleday, p. 177-178)

Women

Christians discontinued practice of veiling; patria potestas (father's right to kill family members); infanticide of female babies; assembly partitions; etc. wage (Alvin Schmidt, <u>How Christianity Changed the World</u>, p. 120)

Labor

Unlike Greco-Roman culture, Christians saw labor as honorable, dignified, a calling, and deserving of a fair wage (Alvin Schmidt, <u>How Christianity Changed the World</u>, p. 214)

Education

Most of the great colleges and universities in the world began as Christian colleges: Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Dartmouth, etc. At least 1,210 languages were never written until Christian Bible translators learned the languages and devised writing for them. (Beisner, <u>Answers for Atheists, Agnostics, and Other Thoughtful Skeptics</u>, Wheaton: Crossway, 137)

Literature

Christian faith motivated and inspired classic works by Augustine, John Bunyan, Dostoevsky, Tolstoy, Pascal, Solzhenitsyn, Dickens, Milton, Defoe, Tennyson, Tolkien, C.S. Lewis, and many more.

Art and Music

Christian faith inspired musical works by Bach, Handel, Mendelssohn, Beethoven, Mozart, and many others, and great works of art by da Vinci, Michelangelo, Raphael, Rembrandt, etc.

Tuesday

Read Acts 2:41-47. Too often we think of ways the Church has fallen short of Christ's purpose for her, but here is one example of the Church doing very well. What do you devote yourself to daily? According to this passage, what do these three thousand converts end up doing? How does this reflect Jesus' prayer in John 13:34-35? What could you do to help our church be more like this?

Pray today that TLC will grow in its reflection of the joy, faith, and generosity of the early church.

Wednesday

Read Acts 20:28-31. In this passage, what does the Apostle Paul warn about?


What does he want the church to do?

Read 2 Timothy 3:1-8. In this passage, what does Paul warn about? Given this list of vices, what "form of godliness" could these people possibly exhibit? Jannes and Jambres were Pharaoh's magicians. How do they help explain what Paul means by "a form of godliness"? Why is this so dangerous? Why do you think corrupt leaders have infected churches in spite of repeated warnings like this in Scripture?

Ask God to help you and to help the church to be on guard against those who want to distract us from a focus on Jesus and His gospel.

Thursday

Jesus also warned many times against the corrupting influence of bad leaders in the church. Read Matt. 7:15-23 and Matt. 23:23-28. Does anything surprise you about Jesus' tone in these verses? How are false prophets like "wolves"?
