"So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, with a continual lust for more." *Ephesians 4:17-19*

Daily Meditations

Monday

Read Ephesians 4:1 and skim back over Ephesians chapters 1-3. Within the context of Ephesians 4:1 what do you think it means to "live a life worthy of your calling"?

What is the greatest obstacle you face when it comes to living a life worthy of your calling?

How can an understanding of this passage free you to be who God has made you?

Thank God today that He has lavished His love on you. Thank Him for the opportunity to read and study the Bible. Talk to Him about the obstacles you face when it comes to living worthy of your calling. Pray that knowing what God has done for you will give you hope and a sense of purpose.

Tuesday

Read Ephesians 4:2-6. What character qualities are listed in verse two? How do these impact unity?

Think about a relationship you have that is suffering from a lack of unity. How could you live out these character qualities in that relationship?

Thank God today that He cares about your relationships. Talk to Him about any part of your life and relationship that are currently suffering. Pray that God will grow you in humility, gentleness, patience and love.

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Wednesday

Read 1 Corinthians 12:1-13:3 & Ephesians 4:7-13. The verses in Ephesians list some of the ministry gifts that God has given to His people. What other ministry gifts are listed in the 1 Corinthians passage?

How does this passage enhance your understanding of the link between unity and ministry?

Thank God today that He has gifted you for ministry. Ask God to give you courage to step out and use the gifts He's given you. Pray that you will be an agent of hope and unity in the church as you minister.

Thursday

Read Ephesians 4:13-16. How do these verses describe a mature person?

Take an honest inventory of your life. How does your life demonstrate this kind of maturity?

In what way would you like to see yourself mature? How can you apply what you have learned in Ephesians to that area of your life?

Thank God today that He is committed to your maturity. Pray for a willing heart to learn and grow and wisdom to know how to live a life worthy of your calling.

Friday

Read Ephesians 4:17-24. How have you seen your mindset impact your actions?

Write down three things you learn about changing your mindset in this passage:

Spend some additional time in prayer today. Talk to God about your current mindset. What are you thinking about your relationship with God? What are you thinking about yourself? What are you thinking about your relationships? Ask Him to show you where your mindset is not biblical. Saturday
