

How to break "The Crazy Cycle":

"Each one of you must **love** his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must **respect** her husband." v. 33

1. Wives, give your husband the _____ he needs

"Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord." v. 22

SURPRISING FACT: The word "submit" is not in the original Greek for this verse. In the original language, this phrase is part of verse 21, reading "Submit to one another out of reverence to Christ: Wives to husbands, as to the Lord..."

Paul himself clarifies what he meant a few verses later when he recaps this section: "... the wife must **respect** her husband." v. 33b

"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church..." v. 25a

How did Jesus love the church? Three examples:

With love that is

"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless." v. 25-27

Yes, but how?

- Learn to say NO! to some non-family obligations
- Ask, "What can I do for you?"
- Major on forgiveness and a fresh start

With love that is ______

"In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives **as their own bodies**. He who loves his wife loves himself. After all, no one ever hated his own body, but **he feeds and cares for it**, just as Christ does the church — for we are members of his body." *v. 28-30*

Yes, but how?

- Have weekly dates
- Get control of the TV
- Learn each other's love language (words, gifts, service, time, or touch)

With love that is

"For this reason a man will **leave his father and mother** and be united to his wife, and the two will become **one flesh**." *v.* 31

Yes, but how?

- Affirm your commitment often
- Check into a hotel for the weekend

- Stand by your woman!


Wednesday
