Nehemiah 6

1. Keep going in spite of

"When word came to Sanballat, Tobiah, Geshem the Arab and the rest of our enemies that I had rebuilt the wall and not a gap was left in it — though up to that time I had not set the doors in the gates, [they] sent me this message: 'Come, let us meet together in one of the villages on the plain of Ono.'" *Nehemiah* 6:1,2

Nehemiah's response: "I sent messengers to them with this reply: 'I am carrying on a great project and cannot go down. **Why should the work stop** while I leave it and go down to you?' **Four times** they sent me the same message, and each time I gave them the same answer." *Neh. 6:3,4*

2. Keep going in spite of

"Then, the fifth time, Sanballat sent his aide to me... in his hand was an unsealed letter: ... 'It is reported among the nations — and **Geshem says** it is true — that you and the Jews are plotting to revolt, and therefore you are building the wall. Moreover, according to these reports you are about to become their king... Now this report will get back to the king; so come, let us confer together." *Nebemiab* 6:5-7

Nehemiah's response: "I sent him this reply: 'Nothing like what you are saying is happening; **you are just making it up** out of your head.' They were all trying to **frighten** us, thinking, 'Their hands will get too weak for the work, and it will not be completed.' But I **prayed**, 'Now strengthen my hands.'" *Nehemiah* 6:8-9 (See Matthew 5:11,12)

"One day I went to the house of Shemaiah... He said, 'Let us meet in the house of God, inside the temple, and let us close the temple doors, because men are coming **to kill you**— by night they are coming **to kill you**." *Nehemiah* 6:10

Nehemiah's response: "But I said, 'Should a man like me run away? Or should one like me go into the temple to save his life? **I will not go!**" *Nehemiah 6:11*

Daily Meditations

Brief daily Bible readings based on this week's message

Monday

Please read Nehemiah 6:1-15. As you think of Nehemiah's story so far, what has stood out to you? How has this impacted you?

What did you learn from the study of Nehemiah this last weekend?

How were you encouraged?

Thank God today that He will never give up on you! Talk to Him about the areas of your life where you feel like giving up. Ask God to give you courage to go forward.

Tuesday

Please reread Nehemiah 6:1-4, Proverbs 4:25,26 & Luke 10:38-41. What kind of distractions did Nehemiah face? How can you relate to him?

What do you learn about distractions from the passages in Proverbs and Luke?

What distractions are you facing today? How have those distractions tempted you to give up on your calling? What do you find helps in dealing with distractions?

Talk to God today about the distractions that you are facing. Ask Him for the wisdom to know how best to put those distractions in their place. Pray for a growing desire to pursue what God has called you to do.

Wednesday

Please reread Nehemiah 6:5-9, Matthew 5:11,12 & 1 Peter 3:8-10. Recall a time when you or your actions were slandered or the subject of gossip. What impact did that have on you?

Recall a time when you were guilty of slandering someone else. What impact did that have on you?

As you read today's scripture write down one thing that encourages you and one thing that challenges you.

Thank God today for His mercy and forgiveness. Ask Him for the grace to forgive those who have slandered you and the courage to move through the hurt of that. Pray that He'll help you control your tongue and that you will not be guilty of slandering anyone.

Thursday

Please reread Nehemiah 6:10-13, Romans 8:15, and 2 Timothy 1:7. Nehemiah's enemies tried to use fear to stop him. How do you see Christians today sometimes hiding in fear rather than living in confidence?

What do you fear that sometimes tempts you to give up?

When you feel afraid, what biblical truths help you to advance in courage?

Ask God for a fresh dose of courage today! Ask Him to help you keep going even when fears tempt you to stop. "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."
