

"I am carrying on a **great project**..." *Nehemiah 6:3b*

How do I develop a passionate purpose?

CH. 1 Nehemiah **hears... feels... prays... meets the need**

"Passion is waking up in the morning, wherever you are, however old or young and bounding out of bed because you know there's something out there that you love to do, that you believe in, that you're called to, something that's bigger than you are and you can hardly wait to get at it. It's something you'd rather be doing more than anything else in the whole world. You invest in it because that cause means more to you than money. And you know it's something that makes the world a better place for other people and not just yourself.

"And when you look at the people who've made the greatest impact, they were the most passionate people. They were not the smartest people, the wealthiest people, the best-educated people, the most beautiful people. They were people of passion. Passionate people are world changers. Think of Mother Theresa, Martin Luther King, Jr., Billy Graham, Paul, David — passionate people who said, 'There's a burning in me that really matters. I don't want to be involved in the trivia of life. I want what counts and I'm not going to waste my life on inferior things.'" — *Whit Hobbs*

Monday

Scan the book of Nehemiah this morning. How would you summarize the book? As you think back over this series, what is one lesson that stands out to you?

Thank God for the impact this study has had on your life. Ask Him to help you find your passionate purpose in life!

Tuesday

One of the character qualities Nehemiah had was compassion. Read 1 John 3:16-20. What does this say about compassion?

Look back over your message notes. Which of the character qualities (passionate purpose, compassion, joy, teamwork or persistence) are strongest in your life?

Is that something that's always been a strength?

How has God used that strength to encourage others? How has He used it to grow you?

Thank God today that He has uniquely gifted you. Pray that the strengths He's given you will be a blessing to those around you and a reason for you to give thanks to Him.

Wednesday

One of the character qualities Nehemiah had was joy. Read Romans 5:1-11. What is the source of Paul's joy? What's your level of joy right now?

As you look at the character qualities we saw in Nehemiah, which would you say is the weakest in your life? Why do you think you struggle most with that particular quality?

How do you think struggling with that has impacted your life and relationships?

Thank God today that He wants to help you grow in character. Talk to God about this character quality that you struggle with. Ask Him to help you make incremental progress.

Thursday

An important character quality you see in Nehemiah is teamwork. Read Acts 2:32-37. What was the impact of the early church's teamwork?

Write down which of these character qualities you'd like most to see developed in you: _____

Write down the name of someone you know whose life embodies this quality.

How would developing this character quality impact your life?

Talk to God about this character quality. Pray that God will help you in this way and use you as a beacon of hope to those you encounter today.
