# **Daily Meditations**

	Read 1 Samuel 17:1-11. What "giant" are you facing?  Illness
	How does the David and Goliath story help you as you face your giant?
	Read the confidence-building verses I handed out this past weekend at least two different times today. I'll be asking you to do this each day this week — you will notice a difference in your courage level! Add to these verses any new ones you discover this week that will help you with your confidence!
	Ask God to help you have confidence in His power on your behalf!  Tuesday
	Read 1 Samuel 17:28-37. Are you surprised that David's brother was so critical? Why or why not?
	How does David's response to Saul help you as you face your giants?
	Read the confidence-building verses we handed out this past weekend at least twice again today.
	Ask God to give you confidence to face your giant!
	Wednesday
	Look back over our notes from this past weekend. Which of the four main points really spoke to you? Why?

Read the confidence-building verses we handed out this past weekend at least twice again today.

Which of these verses is emerging as one of your favorites? Why? Commit that verse to memory today!

Today specifically commit one of your giants to the Lord. Ask Him to help you overcome it!

### **Thursday**

Read Psalm 118:13-25. Last weekend we talked about the importance of remembering past triumphs, proclaiming "The Lord has done mighty things!" Why is this an effective way to increase your confidence in God for the future?

Today recall at least one past triumph in your life: an answer to prayer, a divine provision, a miracle in your life. Share your story with someone today!

Read the confidence-building verses we handed out this past weekend at least twice again today.

Thank God for three specific ways he has sustained and provided for you in the past. Give to Him your specific worries about tomorrow.

### Friday

Read Psalm 27:1-8. We get some insight into the source of David's confidence in this song he wrote. Why do you think he ties his confidence into worship and singing?

How does worship and "dwelling" in God's presence increase your confidence?

Today look at those confidence-building verses again. What differences are you noticing in your confidence and courage after just five days of bathing your mind in God's promises?

Ask God to help you "run to battle" to take care of a giant problem in your life. Take an action today, no matter how small, toward solving that problem!

Please pray for the services tomorrow, that God would bless them richly! Why not read those confidence verses again today — and add to them any new verses you have found!
