Why is it significant that God delivers David from fear and not from the trouble itself?

In verse 19, what are the two truths? Does this verse promise no trouble if you are righteous? What does it promise? What does this mean?

Thank God today that He gives you all you need to face a challenge. Ask Him for the strength to run toward the challenges you are facing.




## After his success against Goliath, things get bad for David...

"David was prospering in all his ways, for the LORD was with him... When Saul saw that he was prospering greatly, he dreaded him." *1 Samuel 18:14,15* (NASB)

- **1 SAMUEL 19:10** "David fled and escaped..." (Six times in four chapters!)
- **1 SAMUEL 19:12** "David fled and escaped..."
- **1 SAMUEL 19:18** "David fled and escaped..."
- 1 SAMUEL 20:1 "David fled..."
- **1 SAMUEL 21:10** "David arose and fled that day..."
- 1 SAMUEL 22:1 "So David... escaped."

# Finally, David ends up in a literal cave...

"So David... escaped to the **cave** of Adullam... And all those who were in distress or in debt or discontented gathered around him... About four hundred men..." *1 Samuel 22:1,2* 

"There is **no one who regards me**; there is **no escape for me**; **no one cares for my soul**." *Psalm 142:4* (One of at least two psalms – Psalm 57 & 142 – written in the cave)

## Five secrets for surviving my "cave times"

# 1. \_\_\_\_\_ my concerns to God

"I cry aloud to the LORD; I lift up my voice to the LORD for mercy. I pour out my complaint before him; before him I tell my trouble." *Psalm 142:1,2* 

# 2. \_\_\_\_\_ my powerlessness

"Listen to my cry, for I am in desperate need; rescue me from those who pursue me, for they are too strong for me." Psalm 142:6

**3. in God's care** "I have no **refuge**; no one cares for my life. I cry to **You**, O LORD; I say, "You are my **refuge**, my

portion in the land of the living." Psalm 142:4b,5 "Have mercy on me, O God, have mercy on me, for in You my soul takes refuge. I will take refuge

in the shadow of Your wings until the disaster has pased." Psalm 57:1

### \_\_\_\_\_ God has a purpose for me

"I cry out to God Most High, to God, who fulfills His **purpose** for me... God sends His love and His faithfulness." Psalm 57:2.3b

"...those who were in distress or in debt or discontented gathered... and David became their captain." 1 Samuel 22:2

# 5. \_\_\_\_\_ through music

"...I will sing and make music. Awake, my soul! Awake, harp and lyre! I will awaken the dawn." Psalm 57:7.8

Hear my cry, O God; listen to my prayer. From the ends of the earth I call to you. I call as **my heart grows faint**;

Lead me to the rock that is higher than I. For you have been my refuge, a strong tower... You have given me the **heritage** of those who fear your name.

... Then will I ever **sing praise** to your name and fulfill my vows day after day.

Psalm 61:1-3,5,8

# **Daily Meditations**

# Monday

Read 1 Samuel 18:14-15, 19:1. What encouraged you most from last weekend's sermon?

In what area of your life do you feel like you're in a "cave"?

How can you apply what you learned last weekend to your "cave time"?

Thank God that He is always with you, even in the "cave time." Ask Him to make you more aware of His presence and rely on His strength and timing.

## Tuesday

Read Psalm 142 (written in the cave). What promises about God does David cling to in this Psalm?

Reread verses 1-2. How does pouring out your heart to God help you when life doesn't make sense?

List three things that encourage you from this Psalm.

How will you apply these verses to your life this week?

Thank God today that you can pour out your heart to Him. Thank Him for His unending care for you. Ask Him to help you remember what you've learned in these verses and apply them to your life this week.

# Wednesday

Read Psalm 57 (written in the cave). David briefly mentions his troubles in this Psalm and then spends the rest of the Psalm dwelling on God. What does "take refuge in God" mean to you? What prevents you from doing this? How can you apply this to your life this week?

Reread verses 7-11. How does focusing on God, praising Him and committing yourself to His plan help you in your "cave time"?

Thank God today for His plan for your life. Commit to following and focusing on Him regardless of your circumstances.

# Thursday

Read Psalm 56 (written when David was fleeing the King of Gath, right before he gets to the cave). How can you relate to David's emotions in this Psalm?

Reread verses 9-13. How does David choose to deal with the unjust treatment he's receiving?

How can you follow David's example in your life today?

Thank God today that He will ultimately bring justice to life. Ask Him for the faith to trust His ways and rely on His comfort in the meantime.
