Read Luke 14:15-24. How would it feel to plan a big event and have no one attend?

How did the master ensure that the banquet would be full?

How does your responsibility to God correspond to the actions of the servant?

Pray that your heart will be full of joy as you see prodigals hearing the message of God's love next weekend — and go to the "highways and byways" to invite them! Please pray this summer's event and church services will bring joy to the church and be effective in reaching our community.

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Wednesday

Read Luke 15:1-7. Recall a time as a child when you were separated from your family or group of friends, or a time when you lost a child. What did that feel like?

In verse 2, what were the leaders grumbling about?

In this parable, how might the sheep have gotten lost? How do you sometimes go astray?

How does a shepherd bring a lost sheep home (vs. 5)?

What does he do when he brings the sheep home?

Thank God today that He will go looking for you! Ask God to show you what you can do this week to help bring lost sheep home. Ask God to give you the courage to invite someone to church this weekend.

Thursday

Please read Luke 15:8-10. What emotions do you feel when you find a valuable item that was lost?

What can you learn about God from this parable?

What can you learn about how God values people from this parable?

With what "lost coin" can you share God's love this week?

Thank God today for His patience and persistence with you. Thank Him for His amazing love. Please pray that God will be bonored in the services this weekend and that we'll have many reasons to rejoice at "found coins."

Friday

In summary of all these passages we've seen this week, how do these three parables answer the Pharisees' objection in Luke 15:2? What do they explain about why Jesus came to earth?

Today I would like to ask you to spend some extra time in prayer dedicating the evangelistic mission of this summer to God in prayer. Pray that the church will grow though this summer. Pray that the people who attend, whether believers or seekers, will grow closer to Christ. Pray that God will lay on your beart the names of some people to invite.
