# **Daily Meditations**

## Monday

Please read 1 Corinthians 13:6-8a. Look back over your sermon notes from last weekend. Which of the points hit home for you this week? Why?

Talk to God today about the areas of your life where you're tempted to give up on love. Thank God for His love for you. Pray that His love for you will flow through you and give you the stamina to keep loving and hoping.

## **Tuesday**

Please read 1 Corinthians 9:12 & Colossians 3:13. In order to have love that lasts we need to learn to get past our own agenda! In what situation did you recently struggle with setting aside your comfort and rights for the sake of another?

How does being willing to bear with someone else build into that relationship?

How has Jesus set an example for us?

Thank God today that the world is bigger than you! Thank Him for His example. Talk to Him honestly about your struggles to set aside your agenda and rights. Ask Him for the vision to see your relationships through His eyes and His hope.

## Wednesday

Please read Acts 15:36-41, Colossians 4:10 and 2 Timothy 4:11, Philemon 23-24.

Who is someone that has believed the best about you? How did that impact you?

What do these passages tell you about Paul and his relationships?

What progression do you see in Paul and Mark's relationship? How does that help you?

How does believing the best strengthen your relationships?

Thank God today for His love. Thank Him for the relationships He has given you. Talk to God about tension you have in relationships. Ask Him for the eyes to see the best in others and the courage to affirm that in them.

#### **Thursday**

Please read Psalm 71:14 & Romans 8:24. It can be difficult to stay hopeful in some relationships. Think of a relationship that has disappointed you. What does godly hope look like in that situation?

What would "hopes all things" look like in your relationships this week?

Thank God today that He never gives up on you. Thank Him that you can have eternal hope in Him. Pray that you'll keep looking forward in your relationships and give the gift of hope.

## **Friday**

Please read Philippians 2:17, 2 Timothy 2:10 & Hebrews 12:2-3. It is challenging to reflect on what "all things" can include. Write down four things these verses teach you about endurance:
