Thursday

Let's go to another classic passage on love in 1 John. Please read 1 John 3:11-24. We started our love immersion with this.

How do you know what love is, according to verse 16?

What is the command we are to follow in verse 23?

What is the result of that command (v. 24)?

When do you struggle with loving someone else with your possessions?

Ask God to show you how to love in deeds — not just words — this week!

In Monday's devotions, we asked you to consider an experiment: Try reminding yourself every morning and every evening of this truth: "I am God's beloved." How did this impact you?
