What questions would you have for Jesus about his words as they relate to your fears? How do you suppose He would answer?

Daily Meditations

Monday

Look back over the notes, reading each verse out loud if possible. Summarize in your own words why God so strongly commands us not to fear:

Tuesday

Let's talk about focusing on God's power. Read Psalm 118:6-9. What comparison does the writer make in verses 8 and 9? In what ways are Americans sometimes prone to "trust in man"? How has this worked out?

How are you tempted to "trust in man" instead of God?

Why is it "better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in princes"?

Ask God to show you where you have been trusting in human plans, human approval, human love instead of in God. Ask Him to help you trust in Him alone. This is a key to living without fear!

Wednesday

Read Psalm 56. When writing, David was being pursued by the Philistines, so it's no surprise that three times he talks about fear! David is very honest; He never denies that his enemies have caused him harm. In fact, if you read his story in 1 Samuel 1 and 2, you find that around this time he had lost almost everything: His position, his riches, his home, his security; even his marriage was falling apart. His very life was in serious danger. So then how can he say, "What can man do to me?" if he had already lost so much? What do you think he means?

What does this mean for you?

Similarly, Christians should not pretend that life does not have hard times. But we need to remember that ultimately God's purpose will prevail!

Bring to God your fears today and tell him how you feel. Ask him for His peace.
