Daily Meditations

Monday Read through all of Psalm 23 today. Are you going through a dark time right now? If not, what was the most recent dark time you've been through? What one point from this weekend's message stood out for you? Read God's encouraging words about life's valleys in Romans 8:35-39! Ask God to help you remember He is right there with you, though you may not feel Him. Thank Him for His loving care of you, as part of His flock! **Tuesday: The Valley of Doubt** Let's talk about the valley of doubt today. Read Matthew 11:1-15. This story always fascinates me. John the Baptist is in a dungeon, and he has doubts about Jesus. Doubts come to everyone in the dark times of life, even spiritual giants like John. But John gets a response from Jesus. Does Jesus criticize John for doubting? Are you surprised by Jesus' response? How can this story help you when you go through the valley of doubt? Thank God for His presence — even when you doubt it!

Wednesday: The Valley of Sorrow

Read Matthew 26:36-42. We can learn so much from Jesus' own valley. What can you see in these verses that helped Jesus — and can help you too?

Are you surprised at Jesus' transparency? Have you ever felt like this? Jesus needed his close friends near him, and even had to coax them to stay with him. How is this a lesson for you and me when we go through valleys?

Why is Jesus' prayer the perfect prayer to pray in such valleys?

Read the encouraging words in 1 Peter 1:3-7. How does this relate to your valleys?

Pray the perfect prayer of Christ today!

Thursday: The Valley of Fear

Read Joshua 1:1-2, 6-9. The Israelites were afraid of their future; Moses had died, they faced powerful enemies, they had no homeland, and they were going into scary territory. How did God encourage them in this valley?

What principles in this passage apply to you today?
