How do you suppose Jesus might have felt as he watched all these events unfold?

Pray that the meaning of Christ's death would become real to the people attending Good Friday services tonight, and Easter services this weekend. Daily Meditations

Monday

Read John 12:12-19. A week before Christ's crucifixion, the crowd shouted, "Hosanna!", which means "Save us now!" What kind of salvation were they apparently expecting?

How did Jesus save them?

On the card in today's bulletin, write down what is troubling you right now... any areas in your life that make you cry out, "Lord! Save me now!"

Take these things to Him in prayer today. Bring the card to the Good Friday services. During the services there will be an opportunity to place this before the cross.

Tuesday

Read John 14. Write down the key truths that Jesus gives the disciples in this chapter. What did you hear in last weekend's sermon that really struck you?

How does it apply to your life this week?

Jesus says he gives us a gift of peace. But a gift must be accepted. Many Christians have received the gift of salvation, but have not yet truly received the gift of Christ's peace. How do you think accepting Jesus' peace would impact your view of your troubles?

Accepting the peace of Jesus involves the release of your desire for control. In what ways can you practically release your control mechanisms to God today?

Thank God today for the peace He offers you. Talk to Him about your fears and struggles to keep control of your life. Ask Him to help you loosen your grip on your troubles and offer them to Him. Pray that His peace will flood your heart and give you the courage to trust Him with your troubles.

Wednesday

Our first point this weekend was to "trust Jesus". This means to trust him for salvation, but it means so much more.

Trust Jesus when he says:

"So **do not worry**, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and **your heavenly Father knows that you need them**." *Matthew* 6:31.32

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." *Matthew 7:7*

"I tell you the truth, he who believes has everlasting life." John 6:47

"I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." $John\ 14:6$

"And surely **I am with you always**, to the very end of the age." *Matthew 28:20b*

Where do you struggle with trusting Jesus?

Bring those areas to Him in honest prayer right now. Pray that God will give you an opportunity to invite someone to Easter services today!

Thursday

Read Matthew 26:36-46. What's been your "Gethsemane" — a place you really wrestled with God?

What do you learn from Jesus' example about praying in those times?

What does Jesus ask of God? How is this a model for our prayers?

Bring to God the areas where you really want something different than what He is allowing. Pray your heart's desire, then add "nevertheless, not my will, but Yours be done."

Friday

Read Matthew 27:27-56.

Many commentators believe Jesus quoted Psalm 22 when he hung on the cross — a psalm that was written 1,000 years before he was even born. Read Psalm 22 and then answer the questions on the next page...
