Even though we know that God's power is available to us, most of us still try to live most of life in our own strength. Think about your life. In what ways have you been content to live in your own power? How does that impact your sense of hope?

In what area of your life would you like to see God empower you and bring you "back to life" (Ezekiel 37:10)?

Thank God today for the power that He has given you through the Holy Spirit. Pray that you'll be notice when you're living life in your own power. Pray that God will breathe new life into the areas of your life where you feel hopeless.

## Friday

Please read Ezekiel 37:11-14, Hebrews 10:23 & 2 Peter 1:3-4. Write down the promises God makes in Ezekiel and how those encourage you today.

What does it mean, practically, to live life relying on God's promises?

Thank God today for the surety of His promises. Talk to Him honestly about ways you're struggling to believe His promises. Ask Him to grow your faith in His promises and pray that you'll live an expectant life – believing that God will do all that He has said.

## Saturday

Please read 2 Corinthians 1:20-22. This is such an amazing verse! All that God has promised is "yes" for us because of the sacrifice that Christ made on the cross. What a gift! Write down three things you know God has promised you.

As you pray today, thank God for His promises. Pray that you will be patient and live confidently knowing that He will do all He promised in the best way and the best time. Please pray for the services this weekend. Pray for Pastor Andy Lewis as he preaches and for Karen Stebbins as she leads worship. Please pray for the 50-day Hope Experience that we will do this fall. Pray that God will use the study of hope to encourage our church and our community!
