Daily Meditations

Here's a chance to spend some time each day this week meditating on today's topic!

Monday

Please read Joshua 2:1 and Luke 7:36–50. What did you learn about Rahab's story from last weekend's sermon? How did that impact you?

As we look at the passage in Luke, we all want to think we'd be the woman who cleans Jesus' feet with her tears. Honestly, which person in this passage do you most identify with?

What does Jesus see in this woman that the others do not?

How have you been tempted to base your faith on who you are? How do things change when you base your faith on who God is instead of who you are?

Thank God today that the Bible is full of stories of His power through the most unlikely people. Pray that you will trust He sees your heart and your potential and He has a plan for you. Pray that you will see people the way God sees them.

Tuesday

Please read Joshua 2:4–7 & James 2:14, 25–26. How does Rahab's fledgling faith turn into action?

How do actions encourage and feed your faith?

Write down two work, home or relationship situations where you could put action to your faith this week. How could your faith impact those situations?

Thank God today for the opportunities you have to live out your faith. Pray that your faith will grow both in your heart and in your actions. Ask God to use your actions to encourage those around you and point them towards God.

Wednesday

Please read Joshua 2:9—12. What fears was Rahab struggling with? How were her fears actually healthy in some ways?

What fears are you struggling with right now?

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How could focusing on God turn you from feeling only your fears, to feeling secure?

As you pray today, lay your fears at Jesus' feet. Ask Him to replace your fear with security. Pray that your faith in God will increase and overshadow your fears.

Thursday

Please read Matthew 1:1–5 & 1 Corinthians 6:9–11. Rahab, this most unlikely hero, is listed as an ancestor of Jesus — that's sure encouraging!

According to the 1 Corinthians passage, what state are we in before we come to Christ? How does Jesus change all that?

How have you seen the truth of this verse in your life?

When you think about the future, do you tend to see it through your own filter or God's filter? How does that impact your hope?

Thank God today that your future is not dictated by your past but by God's plans for you. Talk about the areas of your life where you struggle to see God's view of the future. Pray for the faith to see your future from God's perspective.

Friday

Please read Hebrews 11:1–2 & 31. Not only does God place Rahab in the line of Christ, she also appears in the faith "hall of fame" in Hebrews 11.

How do you feel "unlikely" to be used by God right now?

Write down two ways Rahab's story has encouraged you this week.

Thank God today that He is in charge. Thank Him for the hope you can have because of His love and power. Pray that your faith in Him will increase as we continue to study God's work through unlikely heroes.

So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view... if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!
