BREAKTHROUGH

- Acts 1:15: people
- Acts 2:41: 3,000 people
- Acts 4:4: 5,000 men alone
- Acts 6:1–7: "The number of disciples increased rapidly!"
- Acts 21:20: "You see, brother, how many **thousands** have believed."
- By Acts 21 there were about believers in Jerusalem. The population of Jerusalem was about 200,000.
- One group in a single room expanded to 32 countries, 54 cities, 9 islands, and the capital of the Roman Empire in 25 years.

What fueled the breakthrough of the early church?

What they did not have:

- Unlimited financial backing
- Great buildings
- Stable economy • Favorable government
- Supportive media
- Flawless administration


