How does it challenge you?

While you're not probably under threat of being thrown in a literal fire, you may feel the "fires" of various life situations. Are you able to say, "the God I serve is able..."? And "even if he does not..." I choose to serve Him?

What would it look like to apply the courage of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego to your life?

Pray that you'll have the same attitude and faith of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego.

Thursday

Please read Daniel 3:24–25. Think again today about the "fires" in your life. How does it encourage you to know that God is with you in those fires today?

What is your obstacle to believing He is with you?

Thank God today that you never stand alone — in good times or bad. Talk to Him about your struggles to believe He is with you. Ask Him to grow your faith.
