Daily Meditations

Monday

Read Mark 1:15. How do you think the common person's concept of "kingdom of God" differed from the kingdom Jesus came to bring? How do these same misconceptions still persist today?

Ask God to help you better understand the idea of the kingdom of God.

Tuesday

Read Matthew 6:9–13. In what ways can God's kingdom and will be done on earth as it is in heaven — what does that look like? How can your life, in God's strength and by His grace, be a part of bringing God's kingdom and will to earth?

Today make Jesus' prayer your prayer: "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

Wednesday

Read Mark 4:26–34. How do these parables help explain what the kingdom of God is like? How does this differ from what most people were apparently expecting?

In what ways do you see the kingdom of God slowly growing from a tiny seed to a great tree? How does this encourage you?

Ask God to help you value the kingdom of God even when it is still a tiny seed in a new believer's heart, or in a new ministry area.

Thursday

Read Luke 17:20–21, John 3:1–3, John 18:36. How does Jesus correct other people's perception of what the kingdom of God is? What are some of the important points in these verses?

What does it mean to be "born again"? Why is this an important aspect of citizenship in the kingdom?
