I MUST BE WILLING TO...

1. LET GOD ANSWER IN HIS OWN _____

CASE STUDY: ZECHARIAH

The angel said to him: “Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard...” Zechariah asked the angel, “How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years.” Luke 1:13,18

2. LET GOD ANSWER IN HIS OWN _____

“For my thoughts are not your thoughts, **neither are your ways my ways,**” declares the LORD. Isaiah 55:8

(The angel said) “He will turn the hearts of the fathers to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous—to **make ready a people prepared for the Lord.**” Luke 1:17

RESPONSE TIME

During our response song, present your requests to God.

- You may choose to sit silently and simply pray
- You may want to write out your request and bring it to the front during the response song. This simple gesture may help you see your burden as given to God. Our church staff will pray for the needs on the cards all week.
- You may need prayer right away for an issue burdening you. Our Stephen Ministers will be at the front to pray with you after the service.

DAILY MEDITATION

MONDAY

Read Psalm 8 and make it your prayer today. Look back over your notes from last weekend. Which of the four points do you struggle with the most? Which is easiest for you? Ask God today to help you rest in His time, His way, His power, and His purpose.

TUESDAY

In what area of your life do you struggle with God’s *timing*? Read Psalm 6. Prayers like this are in the Bible partly so you and I know it’s ok to pray with total honesty. David, the author, is upset that God seems to be taking so long to answer his prayers. But in the end, he is certain God will answer—not because of David’s own goodness or religiosity, but because of God’s unfailing love (v. 4). In your prayers today, ask God to help you rest in His sovereignty, including His *timing*. Ask Him to help you remember that His love for you never ends.

WEDNESDAY

Read Psalm 20 and make it your prayer. Verse 7 is a great reminder not to place our ultimate trust in human plans or strength, but in God! In what area are you tempted to focus only on your strength and forget about God? Bring that to the Lord in prayer today.

THURSDAY

Read Psalm 19 and make it your prayer today. What a great reminder of God’s *power*! The first half of this psalm is about the power of God revealed in creation, and the second half is about the power of God revealed in His Word, the scriptures. The same God who created the sun and stars inspired your Bible! How can believing this give you confidence to face life? Thank God today for the light He shines into your life through the Bible.

FRIDAY

Read Psalm 138. The last verse of this psalm says, “The LORD will fulfill His purpose for me. Your love, O LORD, endures forever...” Do you believe that God has a purpose for you, and that it will be fulfilled? What difference would such an assurance make in your daily life? Do you truly believe that His love lasts forever? What difference would it make to believe that? Make this psalm your prayer today!

SATURDAY

Do you ever hear the news and wonder what to do about evil people who cause so much suffering, war, and grief? One thing we can do is pray. Read Psalm 10 and make it your prayer today. If you have time, read the next four psalms, each a plea to God about evil in the world. Also please pray that our church will shine as a light in this dark world—pray for the services this weekend!
