CHARACTERISTIC #1: ____

THEY TAKE GOD-HONORING RISKS!

(The rulers) were greatly disturbed because the apostles were teaching the people, **proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead**. They seized Peter and John... Acts 4:2,3

When they saw **the courage of Peter and John** and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus. Acts 4:13

(Peter and John) "...we cannot help speaking about **what we have seen and heard**." Acts 4:20

CHARACTERISTIC #2: _____

THEY UNLEASH COMPASSION!

Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Acts $2{:}45\,$

DAILY MEDITATIONS

Brief Scripture readings and prayers based on this weekend's message

MONDAY

Read Acts 4:1–22. Would you classify yourself as bold or cautious? What impresses you about this story? Why do you think the resurrection of Jesus turned Peter and John from fearful men into men of courage? How can it have the same effect on you? *Thank you Heavenly Father that you raised Jesus from the dead – and promise resurrection to all those who trust in Him! May that promise help me take God-honoring risks!*

TUESDAY

Read Acts 4:32–37. What characterizes the believers in these verses? Why would the resurrection have made them suddenly more generous? How can it have the same effect on you? Look for ways to show compassion today. *Thank you God for being generous with me! Let the promise of the resurrection – the new heaven and new earth – help me cling less closely to my possessions, and share them more enthusiastically!*

WEDNESDAY

Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. Why do you think Paul has to remind the Corinthians of the gospel? What part of Christ's ministry does Paul emphasize most when he reminds them of the gospel? Why is it so easy to be distracted from this central focus? Why do you think he stresses Christ's appearances? Where you be now if not for the "grace of God"? *Thank you Lord for your grace. Thank you for the power and promise of the resurrection! Help me to always make it central to my faith.*

THURSDAY

What is the difference between hope and wishful thinking? How does the resurrection of Jesus give hope? Read Romans 8:11,18–25. Paul says the same Spirit that raised Jesus will give life to you – this means two things: You get power to live now, and a promise you'll live in the future! *Thank you Father for the hope I have in you! Thank you for demonstrating the glory in store for me through the raising Christ from the dead!*

FRIDAY

Read 1 Cor. 15:51–58. What is the most comforting thing for you here as you consider the reality of your own death? *Write out a prayer of thanks to God for what the resurrection means to you*.

SATURDAY

Read 2 Timothy 1:7-10. This weekend we begin a series in Book of Second Timothy! You'll learn how to grow strong in God's grace. You'll discover how to thrive when times are tough! *Heavenly Father, please bless the church this weekend as we gather to worship and learn. Encourage us with your Word.*
