#### **TWO KINDS OF RELIGION:**

You foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you? Gal. 3:1a

### HOW DO I STAY FOCUSED ON GRACE?

1. REALIZE

#### What Jesus already did

Before your very eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed as crucified. Gal. 3:1b

#### What I've already been given

I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by believing what you heard? Gal. 3:2

#### What I've already experienced

Have you experienced so much in vain—if it really was in vain? So again I ask, does God give you his Spirit and work miracles among you by the works of the law, or by your believing what you heard? Gal. 3:4,5



DO I SPELL MY FAITH \_\_\_\_\_\_ OR \_\_\_\_\_

#### 2. RECOGNIZE

Are you so foolish? After beginning by means of the **Spirit**, are you now trying to finish by **human effort**? Gal. 3:3

#### 3. REMEMBER

Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel **in advance**,,, Gal 3:8

Paul's argument from scripture: Grace is not a new idea

- Abraham was saved by faith, not works (v. 6-7: Quotes Genesis 15:6)
- All nations would receive this blessing (v. 8-9: Gen. 12:3)
- Salvation through the law is impossible (v. 10; Deut. 27:26)
- The righteous live by faith, not works (v. 11; Habakkuk 2:4)

## **GREAT VERSES ABOUT GRACE**

Jesus said, "It is **finished**." John 19:30

From the  $fullness \ of \ his \ grace$  we have all received one blessing after another. John 1:16

And God is able to make **all grace abound** to you, so that in **all things at all times** having **all that you need**, you will **abound in every good work**. 2 Cor.9:8

And you have been made  ${\color{black} \textbf{complete}}$  in Christ, who is the head over every power and authority. Col. 2:10

His divine power has given us **everything we need** for life and godliness... 2 Peter 1:3

**MEMORY VERSE:** This week's memory verse: Are you so foolish? After beginning by means of the **Spirit**, are you now trying to finish by means of the **flesh**? Gal. 3:3

# DAILY MEDITATIONS

**MONDAY** Read Galatians 3:1. Does it surprise you that Paul uses such strong language? Think of the ministry of Jesus. What sort of people did Jesus use strong language to condemn? (See Matthew 23:1-5) Does this surprise you? Was the problem in the Galatian church a similar problem? Why is this particular issue worthy of such strong words? Today ask the Lord to give you the strength to confront legalism in your own life with a clear understanding of the gospel of grace.

**TUESDAY** Read Galatians 3:2-3. As I've shared before, this is probably the biggest stumbling block for me as a Christian. I know I'm saved by grace, but I try to live my Christian life in my own strength. I grit my teeth make resolutions, "I will not sin that sin, I will not sin that sin..." But instead, I should simply say, "Jesus I can't overcome this in my strength. If it were up to me I'd yield. But you live through me now, your strength in me is my hope." Try it! You'll enjoy the results of truly letting go and letting God!

**WEDNESDAY** Read Galatians 5:4-14. Watch bonus material on this passge: **facebook.com/twinlakeschurch** or **tlc.org/sermons/sermon/1384** Look at the section of the notes titled, "Paul's Argument From Scripture". Paul's point is that grace is not a new idea; it was the first idea. As far back as Abraham, we were saved by faith, not works. The law has a purpose - to show us our need for God. But its purpse has never been salvation. Why was this an important point for the Galatians to understand?

**THURSDAY** Reread the list of verses in your sermon notes called "Great Verses about Grace". What impresses you most about these verses? What helpful reminder or new insight did you gain through studying these? Ask God to continually remind you that you already have everything you need for life through Jesus Christ! It is finished!

**FRIDAY** Take five minutes to read all we've studied of Galatians so far: Galatians 1:1-3:5. It's been said that people either avoid failure or seek success. Were the legalists described by Paul obsessed with seeking success or avoiding failure? Author Jeff Harkin says most legalists live dry, joyless lives because their legalism forces them to focus on avoiding failure instead of taking risks for God. Why is this? Why does an understanding of grace free us from the fear of failure? Ask God to help you take risks for him, & to his glory!
