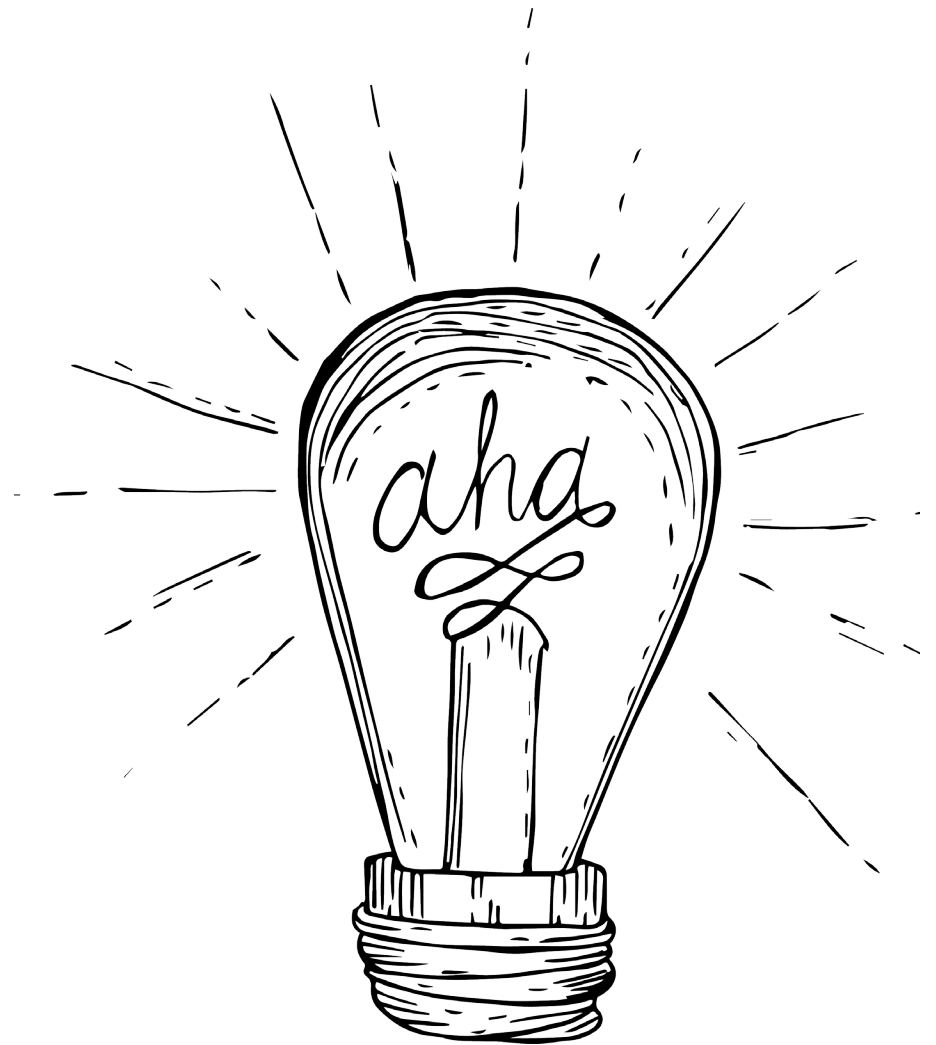
Jared Hinds - bone marrow transplant was successful and he will continue treatment for at least another year. Please pray for he and his wife Nadia as they continue the journey.

After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them.

Mark 9:2-3 (See also: Matthew 17:2 & Luke 9:29)

And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Peter said to Jesus, “Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

Mark 9:4-6

Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: **“This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!”**

Mark 9:7

When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.”

Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.

DAILY MEDITATIONS

MONDAY

Please read Mark 9:1-12. What did you learn about the Transfiguration in last weekend’s sermon? What is a one way you can apply last weekend’s sermon to your life this week? Thank God today for His power. *Thank Him for His love for you. Pray that you will live with a real sense of Jesus Christ’s glory and majesty today.*

TUESDAY

Please read Mark 9:2-3 and Revelation 1:17-18. What similarities do you see in these passages? What’s different? How could recognizing and remembering Christ’s glory impact your daily life? *Thank God today for the Bible and the opportunity we have to learn more about Jesus through it. Pray for a heart that is willing to be filled with awe when it comes to The Lord and His glory.*

WEDNESDAY

Please read Matthew 17:6-7, John 14:27 and 1 John 4:18. Why do you think it’s possible to understand Jesus’ full glory (and in the case of the disciples see it!) and not be fearful? Where are you fearful right now? How could resting in God’s love calm those fears? *Thank God today that His love is equal to His power. Pray for a heart that rests on God’s love instead of fear.*

THURSDAY

Please read Mark 9:7. What does God command the disciples to do in this verse? Why is this so hard for us to do when it comes to God? Out of all the things God the Father could have told the disciples, why do you think He commanded them to listen to His son? *Thank God today for His care for you. Talk to Him about your struggles to listen to Jesus. Pray for a heart to study His word and a willingness to listen to Him over your own preferences.*

FRIDAY

Please read Psalm 119:33-34. Carrying on our theme from yesterday, what do these verses teach you about listening to God? How can you build “listening” time into your life? *Thank God today for the clarity and encouragement found in His word. Pray for ears to hear His voice and a heart willing to follow Him.*

SATURDAY

Please read John 11:38-44 in preparation for this weekend’s sermon. Please pray that God will use our time together at church this weekend to build up our community and to grow each one of us.
