THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

DAILY MEDITATIONS

Brief daily readings based on this weekend's topic:

MONDAY

Read Luke 22:14-16. Why do you think Jesus "eagerly desired" to eat this particular Passover? Read Exodus 12:1-14 to see how Passover started. Backstory: Pharaoh won't let the Hebrew slaves go. So a plague of death is sent. But houses sprinkled with the Passover lamb's blood are spared. What's the connection between Passover and Jesus' death on the cross? How is Jesus the Passover lamb for you? Lord, I'm so grateful for your mercy. Because of Christ's blood shed on the cross I am spared the punishment I deserve for my sin. Help me live in gratitude today! Amen.

TUESDAY

Look over the Passover outline in your notes. How did the Passover meal, including the songs, foreshadow what Jesus did for us? Read Luke 22:14-20. How was Jesus' body "given for you"? In what way is there a "new covenant" between you and God because of the blood of Christ? When you take communion, what do you think about? Lord, I am in awe when I think of how you gave your body and blood for me. I love you because you first loved me so much. Thank you. Amen.

WEDNESDAY

Read Jeremiah 31:31-34. This is a prophecy from centuries before Christ. What is "new" about this covenant (see v. 33-34)? How has that happened in your life? Lord, thank you that my faith is not centered on me trying my hardest to obey religious law, but on how you are changing me from the inside out! Help me rejoice in that today.

THURSDAY

Read Luke 22:24-27. And after that beautiful historic first communion... the disciples miss the moment completely. What are they arguing about? How does Jesus say his kingdom will be different from those of this world? Lord, help me serve others out of love today with no expectation of return. Amen.

FRIDAY

Read Luke 22:39-42. What did Jesus mean by "this cup"? How is his prayer in verse 42 the perfect prayer? Lord, I bring to you today struggles I am facing. Please let them pass from me. But ultimately may your will, not mine, be done. Amen.

SATURDAY

Read Luke 19:1-10 to prepare for the weekend message. Lord, please bless the services this weekend to your glory! Amen.
