What example do you see in Zacchaeus' transformation? How have you seen Jesus' saving power in your life? Lord, I am so grateful today for your saving power in my life. Please continue your work in me today and give me a willing spirit when comes to transformation!

FRIDAY

Read Ephesians 2:10. How do you see God seeking and seeing you personally in this verse? How do you see God's workmanship operating in your life? How do you think it encouraged Zacchaeus to know that God had created him for a purpose? How can that motivate you today? Lord, thank you that I am created by you for a purpose. I pray that as I go through this day I'll remember that truth and live a life looking for ways glorify you in my actions. Please use me as an encouragement in someone's life today.

SATURDAY

Please read Jeremiah 29:13. Father, please give me a heart that wants to seek after you. Thank you for the promise to meet me as I seek you. Please use me as a beacon of hope to point others to you. Use the services this weekend to your glory.
